What have we been learning about this week?

This week, we have had a super week of learning and have been able to get back to normal lessons! We have been learning about persuasive adverts in English, finding out more about their features and planning our own adverts for chocolate bars that we have created. We have been using expanded noun phrases and group of three to include lots of descriptive language within our writing.

In Maths, we have started the week by learning about statistics. We have studied tables, tally charts and block diagrams, collecting and interpreting data.

In PE, we continue to cover athletics elements of the curriculum and have been completing a 5 minute continuous run at the start of each lesson. See if you can have a go at this at home!

In Geography, we used atlases to identify the four countries that make up the United Kingdom and located these on the map. We have learnt more about landmarks that we would find within the UK and have been planning to make our own replicas of these structures as our DT project!

We have found out more about why sleep and rest is so important as part of our PSHE learning, discussing some techniques we could use if we are struggling to sleep. Have a go at some of these over the weekend and remember how important it is to get enough rest!
