What have we been learning about this week?

This week, we have been working hard in all subjects! In English, we have been thinking about spending a day in the Amazon rainforest and writing about what may have happened in the morning, afternoon and evening of our day. We had to use our senses to include a range of different ideas.

In Maths, we have been learning more new vocabulary and have been following instructions to locate the position of something. We have been using words such as 'anti-clockwise' and 'clockwise' and have been making half, quarter and three-quarter turns.
