What have we been learning about this week?

This week, we have been finalising our mystery stories in English, bringing them to an end. We have written these in our Gold Write books and have focused on spelling, handwriting and use of the line guide as well as the content of our work.

In Maths, we have moved on to learning more about time on the analogue clock. We did look at this briefly before Easter, but are now studying the concept in more detail. We have been learning to read different times on the clock, including minutes past and minutes to in five minute intervals.

In Reading, we have been focusing on the key skills we need in order to be successful at comprehension. We have been inferring, retrieving, sequencing and predicting. We have all made excellent progress in reading comprehension this year - well done!

We have been discussing different feelings in PSHE this week and have been able to apply this to our History learning, where we found out that Walter Tull was verbally abused during a football match because of the colour of his skin. We talked about how he might have felt and wrote some questions we would like to ask him. We discussed the protected characteristics, and how we cannot discriminate against anyone based on any of these. With Walter, we related this situation to the protected characteristic 'race' - can you remember any more?

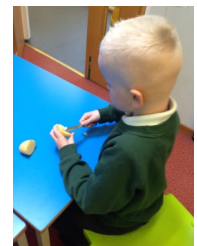
