Keeping Children Safe

Morning Routines

The teachers collect the children from the playground at 8.45am ready for registration, in classrooms at 8.50am, each morning. Please ensure that your child is supervised until this time to ensure that they are handed over safely to school staff. If you need to leave your child before the teacher collects them please speak with a member of staff. **Please note that registers will be taken at 8.50am and closed at 9.00am, to ensure a prompt start to learning, so arrival after registration will be marked as late.**

End of the Day Routines

Due to the gate to the new housing estate being open at the end of the day, we have reviewed our end of day procedures in order to ensure collection time is safe for all. The teachers of some classes will be dismissing children in a different way or place when we return to school on Monday 6th November.

Creswell, Elmton and Welbeck Classes – no change

Rufford Class - Miss Phillipson will keep the children in the classroom and dismiss when parents can be seen outside the window on the back playground.

Clumber Class - Miss Marsh will dismiss children from the front playground next to where Welbeck Class are currently dismissed.

Thoresby Class - Miss Browes will keep the children in the classroom and dismiss when parents can be seen, from the doorway, on the back playground.

Sherwood Class - Mrs Martin will keep the children in the classroom and dismiss when parents can be seen, from the doorway next to Thoresby Class, on the back playground.
