

Physical Education Report for Governors – Chloe Browes Spring 2025

Curriculum Coverage

During this academic year, we have made the transition to GetSet4PE curriculum and moved away from our own curriculums. In 2023-2024, I conducted a staff voice and some staff members didn't feel confident teaching the curriculum as they weren't sure about the range of rules and techniques used in football and basketball, so I provided them tips on where to find this knowledge. Collectively, we all decided that GetSet4PE would be the best to use because it provides fun, engaging activities for children, whilst allowing them to build on their knowledge and apply the skills and techniques in game situations.

In addition to this, after school club have started to use the activities provided on GetSet4PE in their afterschool sessions, so that children can enhance the skills they have learnt which supports their metacognition.

This academic year, the children have been receiving one hour a week each (on a Tuesday) lessons from Harrison, from Worksoop Town Football, who also follows our long term plan from GetSet4PE. The children have said lots of positive things about session including that they are fun, engaging and we have a lot more equipment to support their lessons.

Monitoring

Following from last academic year, teachers noted that it is very time consuming uploading videos/images on our school website because it takes so long to load. They also queried how we assess the children in PE and they wanted to know what 'Greater Depth in PE' looks like. As a result of this, I held a staff meeting and we discussed where we can keep a record of evidence from what the children have learnt in their PE sessions to show the progression of knowledge. We decided to start uploading it onto Class Dojo, so I can use this for monitoring to ensure that staff members are following the long term plan.

In addition, GetSet4PE provides an assessing tool that teachers can use to monitor the progress of children, so I have spent some of my monitoring time uploading all of the children's names to the website and will monitor how the data has been inputted at the end of the half term.

To ensure that the children get the most out of GetSet4PE and their lessons, I wanted to check that we have all of the correct equipment in line with their lessons that they are doing. I conducted a resource audit and wrote down exactly what equipment we already have and what we need. The equipment we required was then ordered and organised so that staff members could easily access it for their lessons.

We ordered footballs, a range of different sized balls, tennis balls and bean bags.

This year, the children have been exposed to a range of different sporting events and activities that supports their knowledge of what they have learnt in PE and have demonstrated to the children how exercise can be an exciting, fun way of maintaining a healthy lifestyle.
