## POLICY TO PROMOTE GOOD BEHAVIOUR.

2022-2023

1. We share the responsibility with parents to prepare children to be good citizens, encouraging them to behave well towards each other, their teachers, their parents and other adults.



2. We recognise that there is a clear connection between behaviour and learning. If children are well behaved, teachers can teach successfully and children are more likely to succeed in their learning.



3. We have high expectations for behaviour, which must be worked towards by parents, teachers and children. We believe that showing children the value of good behaviour in school will lead to increased self esteem and greater self discipline in adult life. We recognise the importance of identifying and positively acknowledging good behaviour whenever it is possible.



4. We aim to provide our children with a positive, safe and caring environment where they are able to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed to grow emotionally and socially, and to thrive in the world outside school.

A set of "Golden Expectations" for behaviour in school have been agreed by the children, through the use of class discussion / Circle Time. These rules have subsequently been presented to and accepted by staff and governors. They have also been presented to parents.
